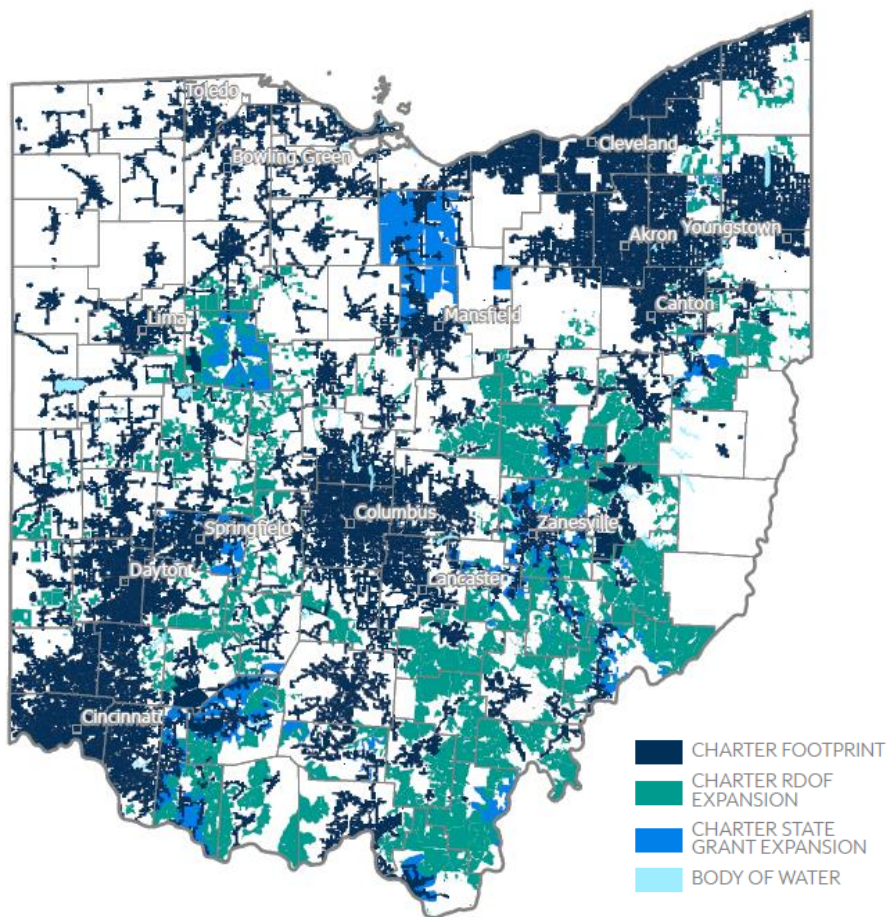

Charter's RDOF and ORBEG Impact in Ohio



CHARTER FOOTPRINT DATA AS OF OCTOBER 2022

- Investing an estimated \$696M in Ohio to build Fiber to the Premise (FTTP) high-speed broadband to approximately 130,000 homes and small businesses.
- Residents will have access to Spectrum's Internet Gig (1000/1000 Mbps) as well as Spectrum TV, Spectrum Mobile, and Spectrum Voice.

Local Awarded Partnerships

- **Clark County** – County provided \$3M in Cares Act funding to build to 415 unserved addresses; completed project in less than a year. Also partnered on an ORBEG application for an additional 1,165 unserved addresses. County contributed \$3M in ARPA funding.
- **Noble County** – Selected by County from RFP process for an ARC funded project
- **Ashtabula, Carroll, and Mahoning Counties** – Partnered with each county on an application for funding through the Appalachian Regional Commission.
- **Jackson Township (Ashland County)** – Working directly with Township to provide service to 659 unserved locations.
- **Portage County** – Selected as winner of County RFP to provide service to unserved areas contiguous to our RDOF Build.
- **Clinton County** – Selected as winner of County RFP to provide service to unserved areas
- **Washington Electric Cooperative** – Partnering on a \$1.5M ARC funded “Make-Ready” grant. WECl offering Spectrum access to fiber-ready poles in exchange for us providing FTTH service to approximately 1,400 households and 200 businesses in the WECl footprint.

Future Funding & Expansion Opportunities



- Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program
- Round 2 of Ohio Residential Broadband Expansion Grant (ORBEG)
- Individual expansion projects at the County and Township level
- Company initiated projects (Putnam County example)

Spectrum Internet Assist: To make broadband more accessible for low-income learners and seniors, we offer this high-speed, low-cost broadband service.

Spectrum Digital Education Grant Program: To increase adoption and access to technology, we offer philanthropic support to community organizations.
