OHIO EPA INITIAL RESPONSE

- Gov. DeWine & Ohio EPA leadership on-site the first weekend
- Embedded in the community for several months
- Initially Incident Command
- Unified Command established:
 - U.S. EPA, Ohio EPA, Columbiana County EMA, ODH, East Palestine, Norfolk Southern, Pennsylvania Dept. of Environmental Protection, Pennsylvania Dept. of Health





OHIO EPA INQUIRIES

MEDIA CALLS

- First weekend: 7 calls
- 1 week out: 50 calls
- 2 weeks out: 188 calls
- 3 weeks out: 307
- 1 month after derailment: 402

CITIZEN INQUIRIES

- First weekend: 5 calls
- 1 week out: 24 calls
- 2 weeks out: 212 calls
- 3 weeks out: 314 calls
- 1 month after derailment: 362 calls



COMMS STRATEGY

- Reactive at first had to be proactive
- Biggest challenge: Combating misinformation
- Able to call on resources from other agencies





OHIO EPA RESPONSE

- Created trackers for calls & common Q&A
- Uniform messaging
- Collaborated with ODOT on an electronic media center
 - Central media space
 - Video & pictures available to media
 - Daily newsletters
 - Interactive maps
 - <u>Story Map</u>

Key Statewide ER Metrics


- Incidents in Past SFY
 - 2,121 Individual Spills Reported
 - 17% Non-emergency reports
 - 50% handled by locals following standard accepted field practices
 - More than 580,000 gallons of spilled liquids recovered and removed last year
 - 12 On Scene Coordinators in the state
 - 24/7 On Call 4 OSCs On Call at any given time
 - 30,000 hours of spill response last year
 - Single point of entry is the Ohio EPA Spill Hotline **1-800-282-9378**







"NON-HAZARDOUS SPILLS"


- Any material in high enough concentrations and volumes can create toxicity and environmental harm
- Wheat, milk, corn, corn syrup, limestone fines, soap, beer, manure
- High oxygen demand in creeks and can cause massive fish kills





ROLE OF RESPONSE PARTNERSHIP

- Every Incident is unique and requires collaborative efforts among local law enforcement, road crews, fire personnel, County EMA with each focused on their roles to redress the emergency
- These partnerships produce success every single day in Ohio
- Unified partner goal is to be there and help someone get through a really bad day
