PLACEMENT SEARCH

- Interests/ Strengths: 12 year old male
- Diagnosis: Disruptive mood dysregulation disorder, oppositional defiant disorder, ADHD, PTSD
- Behaviors:
 - Lying, yelling, racial slurs, hitting, arguing, cussing, offensive language, physically aggressive towards peers and adults, altercations with staff and residents, spits on and threatens physical harm to staff and residents, runaway, property damage, theft, false accusations of staff



PLACEMENT SEARCH

- Interests/ Strengths:
 - 12 year old girl, kind, loving, loves stuffed animals and to draw and play games. Positive most of the time
- Diagnosis:
 - Autism, ADHD, Adjustment Disorder, Disruptive Mood dysregulation disorder, social communication disorder, speech disorder, developmental delays, multiple daily medications
- Behaviors:
 - Experienced neglect, physical and sexual abuse. Fixates on staff and seeks out sexual behaviors and needs to be supervised. Runaway, physically combative and verbally aggressive to staff and peers, encourages others to run away with her

COSTS

- Group Homes and Residential Treatment Facilities \$400/day = \$146k/year
 - Some are upwards of \$850-\$1,000/day
- Treatment Foster Care \$100/day = \$36,500/year

• Each youth placed in Treatment Homes in lieu of Group Homes saves approx. \$100k/year per youth

OUR WORK

- 12 homes recruited, developed, trained as Treatment Foster Homes
- 5 more treatment homes pending
- Expanded Northwest program from 3 to 5 counties
- Helping Ohio expand into 29 additional counties
- Pilot expansion consultants

RESULTS TO DATE

- 19 youth have been placed in Treatment Foster Homes
- Siblings can be placed together
- 3 youth now in Treatment Homes
 - \$492/day to \$50/day
 - \$350/day to \$100/day
 - \$466/ day to \$100/ day
- Participating in a ROI research project to evaluate social impact

Treatment Foster Home Pilot Program

\$2 million being provided across 34 counties to help connect high-need foster children with loving families
