# Outcomes

Measure	CY2023
Referrals	316 90% acceptance rate
Admissions	215
Length of Stay	Trending to stays longer than 30 days Males 60% Females 54%
Average Daily Census	Trending up compared to last year Males 18 Females 8
Successful Completion	Males 82% Females 96% Medical Discharges prior to successful completion impacting success rates

# Outcomes

## **Ongoing Treatment at CRC/GCB**

91% of Men connecting to treatment, remained in treatment at 90 days

77% of Women connecting to treatment, remained in treatment at 90 days

## **Employment Services**

All clients in the program participate in employment readiness and job retention programming. 80% of clients interested in obtaining employment engaged with the ASPIRE Employment Program.

## **Jail Re-Incarceration**

80% of clients who successfully completed were not incarcerated again in the following 12 months

## **Therapeutic Environment**

The 215 admitted CASC clients participated a total of 8393 days in the CASC therapeutic environment vs jail setting.

# Themes for Successful Reentry

- ▶ Identifying internal and external barriers
- ▶ Identifying internal and external strengths
- ▶ Focus on discharge planning while in CASC
  - ▶ Housing, food, clothing
  - ▶ Support System
  - ▶ Employment
  - ▶ Warm hand-off to ongoing treatment provider
- ▶ Impact of physical health and behavioral health
  - ▶ Health Insurance and Medications
- ▶ Increase success on probation
- ▶ Trying something new when the old way doesn't work
