A New Way to Work:

An Update on the Comprehensive Case Management and Employment Program

CCAO is pleased to offer a one-hour "A New Way to Work: An Update on the Comprehensive Case Management and Employment Program" webinar on September 9 at 9:30 a.m. Ohio's new state operating budget establishes a statewide framework that is designed to transform the network of human service and workforce programs to find a New Way to Work for Ohioans in poverty, focusing on with 16- to 24-year-olds, where early intervention can have the greatest impact. This is to be accomplished by aligning Temporary Assistance for Needy Families and Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act monies, with the goal of ensuring that the strengths of local workforce and human services systems are leveraged in a way that focuses on people, not programs. This webinar will provide an update on the Comprehensive Case Management and Employment Program recently signed into law and specifically address:

- Implementation timeline
- County plan requirements
- Designation of a lead agency
- Fiscal update
- Populations served

Speaker: Douglas Lumpkin is deputy director of the Office of Human Services Innovation (OHSI), which is housed in the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS). Lumpkin has served as director of the ODJFS and the Franklin County Department of JFS, and various positions with the Ohio Auditor of State, Ohio Attorney General and Ohio Secretary of State.
