COUNTYWIDE TAX LEVY RESULTS

Following this issue of CIDS is a summary of the county tax issue levy results from the General Election held on November 6, 2007. Thirty counties had no countywide levies on the ballot. Of the 82 countywide levies on the ballot, 61 passed and 21 failed.

Summary of levies: Children Services - 5 pass; Health - 6 pass, 6 fail; Tuberculosis - 2 pass; Senior Services - 11 pass, 1 fail; ADAMH/CMH - 9 pass, 2 fail; MR/DD - 5 pass, 3 fail; EMS - 3 pass; Human Services - 1 pass; 9-1-1 - 6 pass; Transit - 1 pass; Library - 3 pass, 2 fail; Jail - 2 fail; Parks - 2 pass, 1 fail; Soil/Water - 1 pass, 1 fail; County Home - 3 pass; County Hospital - 1 pass; Port Authority - 1 pass; OSU Extension - 1 pass; and Misc. (COSI) - 1 fail.

Four counties had sales & use tax levies on the ballot: BROWN - for 9-1-1, ¼% for 5 years, continuation, pass; HAMILTON - for public safety, ½% for 8 years & ¼% for 7 years for a total of 15 years, increase, fail; KNOX - for 9-1-1, ¼% for 5 years, continuation, pass; and LORAIN - ¼% for a continuing period of time, additional, fail.

PURCHASE OF ELECTED OFFICIAL SERVICE CREDIT

County elected officials recently received a memo from the Ohio Public Employee Retirement System (OPERS) concerning the cost to purchase "elected official" service credit that is scheduled to increase January 1, 2008. To preserve the lower rate for elected official service earned through 2007, members must make a partial payment or submit a payroll deduction authorization form to OPERS prior to December 31, 2007 or within 30 days from the date a cost statement from OPERS is mailed, whichever is later. Call OPERS at (800) 222-7377 to request a cost statement.

If you have already commenced a service purchase for elective service earned prior to 2007, regardless of the method of payment, the cost to purchase that credit was locked in at the contribution rate at the time you commenced the purchase. Future purchases of elective service credit will be billed at the contribution rate in effect at the time the service was rendered. Cost statements will be provided on request.

OHIO HISTORIC PROPERTIES NOMINATED FOR WORLD HERITAGE LIST

The Ohio Historical Society (OHS) urges Ohioans to fire off letters to the National Park Service on behalf of four nominations of archaeological and historic properties in the state for the World Heritage List. "This is an important step toward confirming that Ohio has a world-class history," OHS Executive Director William Laidlaw Jr. said in a news release. "However,

public support will be crucial for nominations to make the final cut in this competitive process."

The World Heritage List maintained by the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization currently includes 851 sites in 141 countries. There are 20 World Heritage sites in the United States (including two sites jointly administered with Canada). The U.S. Department of the Interior, in cooperation with the Federal interagency panel for World Heritage, has identified many more cultural and natural sites as likely to meet the criteria for future nomination to the World Heritage List. Currently, no Ohio sites are included on the list. For more information about the U.S. World Heritage sites go to www.nps.gov/history/worldheritage/.

The three Ohio nominations include: Hopewell Ceremonial Earthworks, Serpent Mound and Dayton Aviation Sites - have been included on the park service's tentative list. OHS is also urging the inclusion of Underground Railroad locations.

HEAP WINTER CRISIS PROGRAM BEGINS; HEATING ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE TO ELIGIBLE HOUSEHOLDS

Lieutenant Governor Lee Fisher has announced that funding is available to assist qualified, low-income, and elderly Ohioans with winter heating costs through the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) Winter Crisis Program, which began November 1, 2007 and runs through March 31, 2008.

The HEAP Winter Crisis Program, administered by the Ohio Department of Development's Community Development Division, provides assistance once per heating season to eligible households that have been disconnected, are being threatened with disconnection or have less than a 10-day supply of bulk fuel.

Qualifying for HEAP is dependent on the size of the household and the total gross household income over the past 13 weeks, which must be at or below 175 percent of the 2007-2008 federal poverty guidelines. Qualified Ohioans can seek assistance at any of Ohio's 53 local service providers. For more information, call the toll-free HEAP hotline at 1-800-282-0880. FEDERAL ACTIVITIES

WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT RESCISSION INCLUDED IN LABOR-HHS CONFERENCE AGREEMENT

The Labor-HHS Conference agreement includes a \$245 million rescission for Workforce Investment Act (WIA) funding from the current year. The House had included a \$335 million rescission while the Senate did not include one at all. This \$245 million rescission will likely come from those states with an excess of 30 percent in workforce carryover funds first. A cut may be applied across the board if the funding from those states with carryover funds is not sufficient. The conference agreement also provides level funding for WIA programs for FY2008. HOUSE COMMITTEE PASSES BILL TO IMPROVE AFFORDABLE HOUSING

The Financial Services Committee of the U.S. House of Representatives passed H.R. 3965, the Mark-to-Market Extension and Enhancement Act of 2007, this week by voice vote. The Act amends the Mark-to-Market Program at the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD).

Mark-to-Market allows owners of Section 8 properties with above market-rate rents to restructure their mortgages so that rents can be offered at a more competitive rate. In addition, the operating costs for owners are also reduced, allowing properties to stay affordable and available to low-and-moderate income families and individuals. H.R. 3965 extends the Mark-

to-Market program until 2012, changes the effective date of enactment and also provides assistance for projects damaged in Hurricanes Katrina, Rita, Wilma and other natural disasters. The bill has yet to be scheduled for a floor vote. (Contact: Cassandra Duhaney 202/942-4204 or cduhaney@naco.org)

CRIME SUBCOMMITTEE IN HOUSE APPROVES LEGISLATION TO DIVERT THE MENTALLY ILL FROM JAIL

On November 1, the House Subcommittee on Crime unanimously approved legislation that will help counties divert the non-violent mentally ill from jail. The Mentally Ill Offender Treatment and Crime Reduction Reauthorization and Improvement Act of 2007, H.R. 3992:

1. Reauthorizes funding for collaborative adult and juvenile program grants for 2008 through 2013 and increases the authorized funding to \$75 million a year;
2. Reauthorizes the Mental Health Courts Program;
3. Reauthorizes and improves the mental health courts grant program; and
4. Creates new programs to
 - (a) Improve law enforcement responses (including campus security) to mentally ill offenders;
 - (b) Improve treatment of female offenders with mental illnesses;
 - (c) Expand capabilities and effectiveness of correctional agencies' abilities to identify and treat mentally ill offenders; and
 - (d) Provide statewide planning grants for new interventions and treatment plans for mentally ill offenders.

SBA DISASTER LOANS AVAILABLE IN OHIO
FOLLOWING SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE
DISASTER DECLARATION

The U.S. Small Business Administration announced that federal disaster loans are available to small businesses located in the counties of Adams, Brown, Clermont, Hamilton, Lawrence and Scioto in the state of Ohio, as a result of drought conditions and higher than normal temperatures that occurred February 1, 2007 and continuing.

Under this declaration, SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan program is available to farm-related and non-farm-related small business concerns and small agricultural cooperatives that suffered financial losses as a direct result of this disaster. Farmers and ranchers are not eligible to apply to the SBA but nurseries are eligible to apply for economic injury disaster loans for losses caused by drought conditions.

Eligible small businesses may qualify for loans for up to \$1.5 million. These loans are available at a four percent interest rate with loan terms up to 30 years. SBA determines eligibility for the program based on the size and type of business and its financial resources. Loan amounts and terms are set by the SBA and are based upon each applicant's financial condition. Under this disaster declaration, the SBA cannot provide loans to agricultural producers.
