IN MEMORIAM

ROBERT A. WOOD

Last week, CCAO and county government lost a friend when former Hamilton County Commissioner Robert A. Wood passed away. Bob was a gentleman through and through. During his 40-year public career he held the titles of Cheviot City Solicitor; County Judge (now called Municipal Court Judge) assigned to Delhi and Green Townships and the city of Cheviot; Hamilton County Commissioner – for nearly 20 years; and Hamilton County Domestic Relations Judge. Just out of Western Hills High School, Bob joined the Army and served in World War II as the Allies fought their way across Europe to destroy Nazi regime. In June 1944, he sailed the Atlantic and landed with U.S. troops at the beach in Normandy, where, six days earlier, the D-Day invasion had occurred. After Paris was liberated, Bob, a military policeman, helped guard Nazi officers taken prisoner in the French capital. After his Army service, Mr. Wood went to the University of Cincinnati, where he earned a degree in political science and received his law degree from the UC College of Law. FEDERAL ACTIVITIES

LEGISLATIVE ALERT: OFF-SYSTEM BRIDGE PROGRAM LETTER – CONTACT YOUR MEMBERS OF CONGRESS

The Off-System Bridge Program is a major source of federal funding for county governments. Off-system bridges are generally owned by county and local governments. There is some concern that this program may be in jeopardy.

As the House Committee on Transportation & Infrastructure works to reauthorize national surface transportation policies, Representatives Graves (R-MO) and Holden (D-PA) sent a letter urging all members of the U.S. House of Representatives to maintain the dedicated investment for off-system bridges in the Highway Bridge Program (HBP) in SAFETEA-LU, or a comparable program, in the next surface transportation reauthorization bill. The letter asks members to sign a letter to the leadership of the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee that supports retaining the Off-System Bridge program in the federal surface transportation reauthorization legislation.

NACo urges counties to contact your member of the Ohio Congressional delegation to ask them to

1. Support for the Off-System Bridge program and
2. Urge them sign the Graves-Holden “dear colleague” letter.

Call your House members’ offices in Washington and ask to speak to the staff person handling transportation issues and explain your position to that staff person. Regular mail takes too long and Congressional offices are often overwhelmed by e-mails. FIRST RESPONDERS “D-BLOCK” LEGISLATION INTRODUCED

Members of the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee introduced legislation that would dedicate a valuable section of broadband spectrum known as the “D Block” to first responders for the creation of a nationwide public safety network. Cosponsors Joseph I. Lieberman (I-Conn.) and John McCain

(R-Ariz.) said the bill (S.1040) is aimed at preventing the communications difficulties first responders encountered after September 11. Both senators are longtime advocates for better interoperable communications among law enforcement and emergency response agencies, and sponsored a similar bill in the last session.

The bill would have to be negotiated with the Commerce, Science and Transportation Committee, which has its own measure (S. 28), a supporter and cosponsor in Chairman John D. Rockefeller IV (D-W.Va.) and jurisdiction over the issue.

The two bills are similar — both would establish grant programs that would provide \$5.5 billion for construction of a public safety network and another \$5.5 billion for operations and maintenance. Both would pay for the network by taking spectrum returned by the first responders and holding “incentive auctions” to the commercial sector. But they differ in how those auctions would be held. The Commerce bill would require the assistant secretary of the Commerce Department to identify 25 megahertz of spectrum between 1675 MHz and 1710 MHz for auction within a year. The Homeland Security bill would require the assistant secretary to identify 15 MHz, and sets specific deadlines for auctioning certain blocks. DIGITAL GOODS AND SERVICES TAX BILL INTRODUCED

The Digital Goods and Services Tax Fairness Act of 2011 (S. 971, H.R. 1860) was introduced several weeks ago. The legislation seeks to protect consumers by prohibiting state and local governments from imposing “multiple or discriminatory” taxes when they purchase items over the Internet. The legislation’s overall aim is to create a national framework for taxing digital commerce rather than relying on the current structure where state and local taxes overlap. A structure that bill proponents argue allow for multiple taxes on goods. Additionally, the bill seeks to prohibit state and local governments from taxing digital goods and services if they do not tax comparable tangible goods.
