CCAO NOMINATING COMMITTEE APPOINTED

The CCAO Board of Directors approved the appointment of a five member nominating committee at the September 16, 2011 meeting of the CCAO Board of Directors, which was held in Columbus. The Committee, appointed by CCAO President David Dhume, will be chaired by Paula Brooks, Franklin County Commissioner. Other members include Commissioners John Love (Putnam), Tony Anderson (Fayette), Lois Snyder (Gallia), and Joe Moroski (Ashtabula).

It is the responsibility of the committee to recommend a slate of officers and board members to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting on Monday, December 12, 2011, during the CCAO/CEAO Winter Conference. Please note that effective in 2010, we changed the day of the Annual Business Meeting held during the Conference from Tuesday to Monday. Nominations will also be accepted from the floor. The committee will be nominating candidates for the offices of president, first vice president, second vice president, secretary and treasurer. In addition, eight members will be nominated to serve on the Board of Directors for two-year terms. The Nominating Committee will also fill any vacancies that may exist where members elected to a two-year term will not be returning to office or where a member forfeits office for non-attendance.

In December of 2010, the CCAO Nominating Committee submitted to the CCAO Board of Directors for approval a resolution that would limit the number of consecutive years a person could serve as either Treasurer (not more than three consecutive years) or Secretary (not more than one consecutive year). They also recommended that persons serving in the offices of Treasurer and Secretary be of different political parties. This was done in an effort to maintain political balance on the CCAO Executive Committee and to give the incoming President greater flexibility in making appointments to the Executive Committee.

The recommendations as submitted by the CCAO Nominating Committee were approved by the CCAO Board of Directors and became effective January 1, 2011. The Board felt the recommendations made sense and would promote continued growth of the Association. The Board also felt that limiting the terms of Treasurer and Secretary would provide a greater opportunity for those Board Members interested in serving as a CCAO Officer. Before a Board Member can be an officer, he or she must have served on the CCAO Board for one year.

We also want to remind members that in 2010 the membership approved several changes to the CCAO Bylaws, one of which is Article IV, Section 6, that requires each member county to designate an Official Representative and Alternate when voting at the Annual Meeting or any special meeting of the Association.

The designation of the Official Representative and Alternate for a county organized under the statutory form of county government is by resolution of the board of county commissioners. In the case of a county organized as a charter county with an elected executive, the elected executive designates, by a letter signed by the executive, the Official Representative and an Alternate. Please note in designating the Official Representative and Alternate, a member county may only name a county commissioner, elected executive, or the member of the legislative authority of any charter county.

The nine members appointed by President David Dhume whose one year term to the Board expires at the end of this year include: Tony Anderson (Fayette), Steve Arndt (Ottawa), Thomas Graham (Jefferson), David Hartley (Clark), Ralph Jennings (Brown), Ted Kalo (Lorain), Jim Riepenhoff (Jackson), Dennis Stapleton (Delaware), and David Wesler (Preble).

In accordance with the CCAO Bylaws, the six most recent past presidents who still hold the office of County Commissioner are entitled to a seat on the Board of Directors. In 2012 those individuals will include: Commissioners David Dhume (Madison), Paula Brooks (Franklin), Kerry Metzger (Tuscarawas), Daniel Troy (Lake), Olen Jackson (Morrow), and Lenny Eliason (Athens).

The Committee must make its recommendations no later than November 18. The report will then be published in the *County Information and Data Service* and an individual copy of the report will be sent to each commissioner. On September 16, CCAO sent to all commissioners at their home addresses an application form to express interest to become an officer or a member of the CCAO Board.

CAB 2011-02: COUNTY BUDGET QUARTERLY SPENDING PLANS

H. B. 153, the state biennial budget bill for the FY 2012 and 2013, amended ORC Section 5705.392 dealing with the authority of the board of county commissioners, as a part of the annual or amended appropriation resolution, to include a quarterly spending plan as a part of the appropriation resolution.

Under the former law, if commissioners included a quarterly spending plan as a part of the appropriation resolution, the spending plan could only apply to appropriations from the general fund. Likewise, if a quarterly spending plan was used, it had to apply to all appropriations from the general fund. If a quarterly spending plan was adopted, the amount of the quarterly allotment, by line item, was used by the county auditor to certify the availability of funds pursuant to ORC Section 5705.41(D).

While these provisions of the law are not changed by the Act, commissioners are given additional authority to adopt quarterly spending plans. The Act grants new authority to commissioners to adopt a quarterly spending plan that applies to individual county offices if the county office expends more than 60% of its appropriation for personal services or payroll during the first six months of any year.

In addition, if a county office, during the previous fiscal year, spends 110% or more of the total amount appropriated for personal services and payrolls in the annual appropriation measure required to be adopted not later than April 1 of each year by ORC Section 5705.38, then commissioners may also adopt a quarterly spending plan for individual offices.

In both of these cases, the quarterly spending plan may apply to any county fund, not just to the general fund. The effective date of this legislation is September 29, 2011. To ready a copy of CAB 2011-02 go to www.ccao.org > Publications > County Advisory Bulletins.

HHS ANNOUNCES AFFORDABLE CARE ACT FUNDING OPPORTUNITY TO CREATE JOBS BY BUILDING, RENOVATING & REPAIRING COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced the availability of approximately \$700 million to help build, expand and improve community health centers across the U.S. to provide needed care to

low-income Americans. The funds, authorized by the Affordable Care Act, will support renovation and construction projects, boosting centers' ability to care for additional patients and creating jobs in those communities. Two funding opportunities are available for community health centers:

1. Provides approximately \$600 million to existing health centers across the country for **longer-term projects** to expand their facilities, hire more employees and serve more patients and
2. Emphasizes **shorter-term projects** with approximately \$100 million to existing health centers to address immediate facility needs.

Over the next five years, the Affordable Care Act provides \$11 billion in funding for the operation, expansion and construction of community health centers across the country. This expansion of sites and services will help community health centers to increase the number of patients receiving care, regardless of their insurance status or ability to pay. MARKETING / RECRUITER
