#### CAB 2012-07: RECENT CHANGES TO LAW RELATING TO COMPETITIVE BIDDING, PURCHASING & COUNTY FINANCE

CCAO has published County Advisory Bulletin 2012-07 "[Recent Changes to Law Relating to Competitive Bidding, Purchasing & County Finance](#)" that discusses Am. Sub. HB 509, introduced by Representative Terry Blair (R-Washington Twp.) as the local government mid-biennium review (MBR) bill. This legislation was one of several bills sponsored as reforms sought by Governor Kasich as part of a mid-biennial review of the current state budget.

Several provisions of HB 509 related to purchasing and competitive bidding were requested by CCAO, including a number of provisions that had been initially introduced by Representative Terry Boose (R – Norwalk) as HB 430. Through an omnibus amendment these provisions were incorporated into HB 509 which took effect on September 28, 2012.

In addition, in separate legislation (HB 487) the legislature has repealed the requirement that certain applicants for licenses, government contracts, and candidates for public employment complete a questionnaire or Declaration of Material Assistance/Non-assistance (DMA) form. The repeal of the DMA requirement took effect September 10, 2012.

The purpose of this CAB is to summarize the provisions of HB 509 that relate primarily to county purchasing, bidding and finance and the provisions of HB 487 repealing the DMA form requirement. A separate County Advisory Bulletin 2011 – 02, revised in August 2012, summarizes changes made by HB 509 to county budget quarterly spending plans.

In addition to financial assistance provided by the Ohio Housing Finance Agency, homeowners at risk of foreclosure due to unemployment or underemployment may utilize the Foreclosure Mediation Program offered by the Ohio Supreme Court. When foreclosure prevention fails, local officials in certain counties may utilize land banking in order to assist certain communities with the reclamation, rehabilitation, and reutilization of vacant, abandoned, and foreclosed properties. County officials are encouraged to attend this program to learn more about the assistance that is available for financially troubled homeowners and the option of land banking in certain counties when property has been abandoned or foreclosed.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday sessions are designed to be interactive, allowing ample opportunity for attendees to ask questions and have dialogue directly with speakers. ## STATE ACTIVITIES

### OHIO EPA TAKES NOTE OF ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENTS ON ITS 40TH ANNIVERSARY

After 40 years of dedication and hard work to help improve the environment, the state can reflect on the great strides Ohio EPA has made since the Agency was formed on October 23, 1972. Due to the efforts of many, the air and water in our state today are significantly cleaner and while this can be deemed a success, Ohio EPA is focused even more intently on using common sense solutions to make Ohio an even better place to live and work in the next 40 years moving forward.

Here are some indications of success over the past four decades:

- In the 1980s, 21 percent of big rivers met aquatic life standards. Now, 89 percent meet.
- Since the 1970s, carbon monoxide in the air is down 80 percent; sulfur dioxide is down 71 percent and lead is down 95 percent.
- Today, Ohio has 40 licensed, protective landfills instead of 1,300 open dumps.
- 99 percent of community public water systems now meet health-based standards, up from 85 percent in 1993.
- A national leader in water monitoring, Ohio EPA has collected and analyzed more than 26,000 fish samples; 12,000 aquatic insect samples; and 100,000 water sediment and wastewater samples.
- Ohio EPA's emergency response program was one of only 11 in the U.S. in 1978 and remains a leader.
- The amount of residential and commercial waste recycled annually jumped from 2.26 million tons in 1990 to 3.5 million tons in 2010.
- Ohio EPA has funded cleanups of more than 30 million scrap tires.

### HEAP PROGRAM BEGINS NOVEMBER 1

The Ohio Development Services Agency (ODSA) announced that the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) Winter Crisis Program is available to qualified Ohioans with winter heating costs November 1, 2012 through March 31, 2013. The Program provides assistance once per heating season to eligible households that are threatened with disconnection, have been disconnected or have less than a 10-day supply of bulk fuel. Last year, approximately 155,000 households were served during the program year.

### **SYLLABUS**

**2012-036**

1. A competitive bid submitted to a county contracting authority under R.C. 307.86-.92 is an offer to enter into a public contract with the contracting authority at the specific price and terms stated in the bid.
2. A competitive sealed proposal submitted to a county contracting authority pursuant to R.C. 307.862 is an offer to enter into discussions and negotiations with the contracting authority for a public contract.
3. Pursuant to R.C. 307.862(C), information in a competitive sealed proposal submitted to a county contracting authority pursuant to R.C. 307.862 becomes a public record that must be made available for public inspection and copying under R.C. 149.43 after the contract is awarded, unless the information falls within one of the exceptions to the definition of the term "public record" set forth in R.C. 149.43(A)(1) and is redacted from the proposal by the contracting authority.
4. Pursuant to R.C. 307.87 and R.C. 307.88, information in a competitive bid submitted to a county contracting authority under R.C. 307.86-.92 becomes a public record that must be made available for public inspection and copying under R.C. 149.43 after the bid is opened by the contracting authority, unless the information falls within one of the exceptions to the definition of the term "public record" set forth in R.C. 149.43(A)(1) and is redacted from the bid by the contracting authority.
