## Gov. DeWine Press Conference: statewide face covering order effective tomorrow at 6 p.m.; travel advisory for certain states

Gov. DeWine announced during his press conference today that the Ohio Department of Health is issuing a statewide face covering order effective tomorrow, July 23<sup>rd</sup> at 6 p.m. The order will be the same as the order currently applying to Red Level 3 counties. Order text will soon be available <a href="here">here</a>. Masks must be worn at all times when:

- At an indoor location that is not a residence
- Outdoors, when unable to keep 6 feet social distance from those not in your household
- When waiting for, riding, driving, or operating public transportation, taxi, car service, private rideshare

The order does not apply to children under the age of ten. Other exceptions include:

- Those with a medical condition or a disability or those communicating with someone with a disability
- Those who are actively exercising or playing sports
- Those who are officiants at religious services







- Those who are actively involved in public safety
- · Those who are actively eating or drinking

Gov. DeWine also announced a travel advisory for anyone traveling into Ohio from states reporting positive test rates of 15 percent or higher. The administration recommends that those travelers self-quarantine for 14 days upon returning to Ohio. The list of states with positive test rates of 15 percent or higher will be updated every week based on a seven-day rolling average. The current list is Alabama, Arizona, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Mississippi, South Carolina, Nevada, Texas and Puerto Rico.

The governor also announced that the Public Health Advisory System indicators will be updated tomorrow. This week the ICU indicator will be updated. Currently, the ICU indicator is flagged if regional ICU capacity exceeds 80 percent or normal capacity for at least three days in one week. The indicator will be updated to be triggered if capacity exceeds 80 percent and 20 percent of normal ICU capacity is being used for COVID-19 positive patients. The governor stated this change will improve the indicator to ensure it is reflecting a higher ICU level due to COVID-19 specifically. More information on indicators can be found here.

The governor reiterated that county fair guidelines be follow for those fairs that are moving forward. Those guidelines can be found <a href="here">here</a>. The new face covering order will apply to county fairs moving forward.
